When our 19-month-old son Alexander died unexpectedly, around Christmas of 2008, we were devastated. His death was determined to be a very rare case of Sudden Unexplained Death in Childhood (SUDC), which accounts for only 1.3 deaths per 100,000 children in the U.S.

Through our grieving, we decided on three things: 1) to channel our loss into good, 2) to keep our son's memory alive and 3) to raise awareness of SUDC.

As part of this, someone suggested we start a scholarship fund in Alexander's name. We didn't have a vast amount of money, but friends and family all around the country offered to help get Alexander's fund started.

We knew that the Community Foundation was well-respected, so we came to them for help. The Community Foundation team was very supportive in establishing the Alexander Michael Dodson Memorial Scholarship Fund. They helped us think through our goals, maximize the fund's impact, steward the money and achieve our objective of supporting educational enrichment for Trenton kids.

As novices to philanthropy, we are forever grateful for their advice.

We were so impressed with the Community
Foundation that we decided to also establish a
Dodson Emerson Family Fund, which allows us
to serve the community in other ways as well.
We are pleased to support area organizations
through the funds that the Community
Foundation helps us manage.

Reverend David McAlpin, founder of Habitat for Humanity of Trenton, cares deeply about the well-being of this community and its people.

"I grew up in Princeton, attended Princeton University and first felt a call to ministry here," he recalls. "I always felt a deep concern for people living in the town's Witherspoon neighborhood, and once I joined the staff of the Witherspoon Presbyterian Church, I quickly became engaged in service to Trenton communities."

He first came to the Community Foundation in 1998, starting a donoradvised fund to simplify his giving. Because of his deep interest in local causes, we suggested our Greater Mercer fund that focuses on the nonprofits doing the strongest work here. It's been a perfect fit.

McAlpin cherishes his relationships with local organizations, many of which he has supported for decades, including these four:

- Habitat for Humanity of Trenton, where he has been building homes for families in need since he helped found the organization in 1986 and then served as its President for 25 years
- Metamorphosis Ministries and the New Jersey Association on Correction,

through which he has ministered to prisoners

- The Montgomery Friends of Open Space and the Stony Brook-Millstone Watershed Association (an organization McAlpin's father founded), which both speak to his personal passion for conserving NJ's environment
- Witherspoon Street Presbyterian Church, where McAlpin served as Associate Pastor early in his career and began his ministry work with underserved communities in need



To help with that effort, our Fund for Women and Girls supports Safe Dates, an after-school program that equips middle-school girls to prevent and escape dating violence.

The program is run by RISE, the largest and oldest social service organization in Hightstown and East Windsor.

"Safe Dates provides the only 'safe place' for at-risk girls to talk with their peers and a caring adult," says Leslie Koppel, Executive Director of RISE, which has served this community for almost 50 years.

"We teach essential skills," says Koppel, "including how to bond with

each other, build lasting relationships and ask for and give help. The girls then 'pay it forward' by showing their friends and parents what it means to have relationships based on trust and friendship."

Thanks to the support of the Fund for Women and Girls, RISE is also able to offer access to domestic violence counseling in the East Windsor, Hightstown and Twin Rivers schools.



## PATH TO IMPACT CAPACITY-BUILDING PROGRAM

We provide training and resources to help nonprofits work as effectively and efficiently as possible—and to increase their impact on our community. To that end, we launched the Path to Impact Capacity Building Program in 2014 to help nonprofits. Our approach is three-fold:

#### TRAINING SEMINARS

Our ongoing workshop series covers topics that are challenging for nonprofits—from skills like fundraising, board development and technology, to big-picture issues like leadership development and program evaluation.

#### PEER LEARNING GROUPS

Twice a year, we host peer learning groups composed of local nonprofits that closely examine specific topic areas. Nonprofit leaders meet together with a professional facilitator once a month for six months. Each participating organization leaves with a written plan of action.

#### **CAPACITY BUILDING GRANTS**

Participants in the Peer Learning Groups are eligible to receive capacity building grants that help them apply what they have learned to their organization.

#### PHILANTHROPY EDUCATION

We offer educational opportunities for everyone – annual seminars for the community, exclusive learning opportunities for our donors, and skills-based workshops taught by national thought leaders for nonprofits.

# LOCAL SUCCESS YMCA OF TRENTON

When Samuel Frisby took on the position of CEO of the YMCA of Trenton—one of the oldest YMCAs in the United States—the organization was at an all-time low of just 300 members. It was fighting to keep the doors open.

"We were in pretty bad shape the first time I met with the Community Foundation," says Frisby. "But they didn't care. They just told me what I needed to do in order to get funded. They wanted us to be able to make an impact in the City of Trenton."

Over the next two years, Frisby and his team worked hard, applying recommendations the Community

Foundation provided—everything from cleaning up their audits to refocusing their vision. By fall of 2013, they had improved so significantly that the Community Foundation awarded them an unrestricted grant to continue growing their organization. The money helped them build their infrastructure and pursue—and win—additional grants.

Today the YMCA of Trenton has quadrupled its membership to 1,300, and it focuses on nurturing the potential of the most valuable community asset—our children—while promoting healthy living and fostering a strong sense of social responsibility.

"It's been a pretty phenomenal ride over the last four years," says Frisby, who is excited about what lies ahead for the YMCA of Trenton and about their ongoing partnership with the Community Foundation.




