

## **EDUCATORS GIVE BACK**

The Dobkin Gespass Fund

"In a community like Princeton, it's easy to lose sight of the fact that there are people who don't have what we have."

David Dobkin, PhD, and Suzanne Gespass, PhD, have dedicated their lives to educating young people. He is the Phillip Y. Goldman '86 Professor in Computer Science at Princeton University and she recently retired from Rider University, where she taught teacher education with a focus on literacy.

"We believe in education at all levels because it's what we do," said David. "In a community like Princeton, it's easy to lose sight of the fact that there are people who don't have what we have." Using their donor advised fund at the Princeton Area Community Foundation to give to the Princeton Young Achievers (PYA) program at the Princeton Family YMCA was a natural fit.

The couple established their fund at the Community Foundation in 1999. For several years, Suzanne was on the PYA Board of Trustees, and she served as the chair of its program committee. As a result, the couple's fund supports the PYA's learning centers, which provide after-school tutoring and enrichment activities in children's own neighborhoods.

"We're happy to support it," said Suzanne.

Now they are also sharing that tradition of generosity with the next generation. The

family's adult children and their significant others participate every Thanksgiving, when their parents ask each to choose a nonprofit to support through the Dobkin Gespass Fund.

"I think our kids really got something out of it," Suzanne said. "It made them think and made them more aware that it's important to give. It was really nice."

"We've had a wonderful life," said David. "A lot of good things have happened to us and we're grateful for that."

## PRINCETON YOUNG ACHIEVERS

Safe, affordable after-school care

Why do children love the Princeton Young Achievers (PYA)? Kids say it's the homework help, pizza parties, exposure to new skills like public speaking, and field trips. Parents say they are grateful for PYA, run by the Princeton Family YMCA, because it is a safe, affordable after-school care program.

"We know that after school our kids were going to be sent to PYA, so I was thrilled when I heard about it," said Jacqueline Washington. "I couldn't afford another local after-school program so PYA was a Godsend."

The program serves 85 Princeton children who live in affordable housing complexes or receive free or reduced-price school lunches. It provides homework help, one-on-one tutoring, literacy support and other enrichment activities for students in grades

K-5. PYA's excellence has been recognized with multiple grants from the Community Foundation – both the Greater Mercer Grants and many donor advised funds support this critical work.

Jacqueline's son, Denzel, 15, and his cousin, Aba Smith, 14, are graduates of the program.

Denzel said he learned to be disciplined with his schoolwork, to be mindful of his manners and to take steps to build strong friendships through the program.

"Besides academics, they always gave me courage," said Denzel. "If I was down, they cheered me up. Whenever I gave up, they wouldn't give up on me. They always helped me."

This year, Aba volunteered at the YMCA's summer camp, using the skills she learned as a PYA student to work with 4- and 5-year-olds. Denzel volunteered as a junior counselor at Princeton University's summer STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Math) camp, and during the school year, he plans to volunteer at PYA. Both teens now attend Princeton High School.

Denzel's mother loves that PYA's staff and volunteers are kind and generous, treating the children as if they were their own.

"It's a very good after-school program," Jacqueline said. "And it's affordable. Even compared to the Trenton area, the price is very reasonable. The funders – we are so grateful to them, for their care and love, and for establishing such a unique after-school program."

#### TRENTON COMMUNITY MUSIC SCHOOL

"I think we sound better when we play all together," Thomas, a fifth grader at Grant Elementary School in Trenton, said as he and his classmates prepared to join the Princeton Symphony Orchestra for the PSO's annual Holiday POPS! concert at Richardson Auditorium.

Thomas is a member of Trenton Music Makers, created last year by the Trenton Community Music School.

With this year's Greater Mercer Grant from the Princeton Area Community Foundation, music school leaders hope to expand the program at Grant School and replicate it at the Grace A. Dunn Middle School, said Carol C. Burden, the Executive Director of the Trenton Community Music School. Students enrolled in similar programs elsewhere showed improvements in memory, attention, and inhibition control and had better than average graduation rates. Organizers here are hoping for similar results. In the meantime, the program is helping youngsters learn to collaborate and face their fears.

"When I played in front of so many people, I felt both scared and brave at the same time," said another music student, Wyaliz.

#### **EVERY CHILD VALUED**

Jaiela, 9, likes the Every Child Valued (ECV) after-school program because she practices multiplication and fractions there.

Davon, 9, described the program as "fun," and his friend, Justin, 6, said "I love it."

They are among the 80 kindergarten through sixth-grade students who live in Eggerts Crossing Village in Lawrenceville and attend the ECV After-School Program. It is one of many nonprofits funded by the Princeton Area Community Foundation's Greater Mercer Grants.

ECV also has an after-school tutoring and mentoring program for students in grades 7-12 and a summer program.

"These teachers teach as if there is no tomorrow," said Kate Wood, a member of the nonprofit's board who also volunteered at the summer program. "This is a very, very important place and I didn't realize it until this summer."

Executive Director Nicole Cody is also a graduate of the Community Foundation's Path to Impact, a capacity building program for nonprofit leaders. She used lessons

learned there in her most recent holiday and summer fundraising appeals.

"We raised the most money ever, so I was thrilled," she said. "I think it was partly because of the strategies we implemented from the workshops, particularly about storytelling."

Those funds help support students like Darrius, 9, who enjoys the program's daily snacks and occasional field trips.

"I think it's really fun and it's a good way to get our homework done before we go home," he said.





- **3. DISCIPLINED** Today's market events do not change our outlook; our Investment Committee plans for the long term.


